
KINDERGARTEN

THEMES: Creation Is a Gift; Order, Design & Meaning; Generosity & Fruitfulness (Creative Love); Beauty; Original Solitude


FIRST GRADE

THEMES: Creation Is a Gift; Human Work; Vocation; Virtue & Freedom




A SEED IS SLEEPY by Dianna Aston, illustrated by Sylvia Long

SAINT GEORGE AND THE DRAGON retold by Margaret Hodges illustrated by Trina Schart Hyman


A knight is on a quest to save a kingdom from a ferocious dragon. As a Christ figure, this knight invites us to ponder virtue, freedom and the gift-of-self.

THEMES: Gift; Fall & Redemption; The Body Reveals the Person



THEMES: Dignity of Work & Gift-of-Self; Suffering, Sin & Transformation; Sacramentality of Creation; Redemption


